









## FOUND ONE OF THESE?

Deer, Bat, Fox, Bird

**DEER:** Never attempt to approach an adult deer, even if it is injured. Call Lisa at 904-686-4422.

If you've found an uninjured fawn, leave it alone but check on it hourly. Mother deer hide their babies and watch from a distance. She should come back for it within a few hours.

If the mother does not return or if you find an injured fawn, or it is becoming dark outside, call Lisa at 904-686-4422.

FOX: Never touch or approach a fox, even it if is injured. Foxes can cause severe injury and are rabies carriers and could transmit the disease to you if they break skin at all. If you are bitten or scratched by a fox, go to the hospital immediately for a post-exposure rabies vaccination. Call Lisat at 904-686-4422.

**BAT:** Never touch or pick up a bat without bite-proof gloves. Bats are rabies carriers and could transmit the disease to you if they break skin at all.

If you are bitten or scratched by a bat, go to the hospital immediately for a post-exposure rabies vaccination.

If you find a bat on the ground or with injuries, call Tri-County Wildlife Care at 504-715-2520.
